A lot has been happening at the Hall recently as chief volunteer Will Murdoch and his ever-changing crew have been preparing for the final approval from the County and the issuance of a Use and Occupancy Permit. As of this writing, the ramp is complete as are the final inspections for electrical, HVAC, and plumbing. The water has been tested and approved by the Health Department. The alarm for the holding tanks has been connected, and County approval for the tanks is in process. Because of a new requirement recently added by the state we needed to have fire retardant applied to cover the foam insulation in the Annex attic. (You may have noticed the attic stairs were pulled down and the doors to the Annex wide open to air out the fire-retardant fumes.) Since then, the Fire Marshall has made his inspection and given his approval! The parking space for handicap access will be paved soon. Thanks to all who worked to make all this progress possible!
